Partners' Semi-annual Technical Report Guidance

To standardize the semi-annual reports and to help partners convey clear and concise periodic updates, we are sharing the below guidelines and templates. The reports you submit should communicate the progress made toward reporting period targets, process through which the progress was made, and issues and challenges encountered and mitigation plans put in place during this period. Please report activities conducted and achievements made through both EAC and partner co-funds, and not only what was achieved through EAC's portion of funding. Also, please ensure that all data in the technical report align with data provided in financial and M&E reports.

The report should include the following sections:

1. Project Cover Sheet:

This page captures basic project information and OOSC enrollment targets and achievements. **Template provided below.**

2. Executive Summary:

This is a one-page summary of the report and should highlight major accomplishments, outcomes and key outputs, and challenges.

3. Project Implementation Overview:

In line with the project Results Framework, this section provides a narrative update of the project's implementation progress:

- Discuss the progress made towards targets for each outcome and output including the activities aligned with them. It is important to cite strategies used by the project to 1) identify, 2) enroll, and 3) retain out of school children;
- Describe activities planned for but not completed this reporting period and plans for completing them;
- Use project results/outputs and related activities from the project's results framework or log frame to organize this discussion. Use a relevant numbering system where possible to show the different levels of results such as 2.1, 2.1.1, 2.1.1.1.
- Highlight major implementation and operational challenges, issues faced and the
 mitigation strategies used to address them.
 Include a description of Covid-19 related challenges and mitigation actions implemented
 or planned.

4. Project M&E Overview:
